During the CW Board of Directors meeting held on November 11 the board met with the Fire Marshal Todd Conradson and his team. The two-hour meeting led both parties to agreeing that more time is needed to review how Carnelian Woods would be able to use natural gas barbecues on their decks.

We have a long road to travel prior to this being a "done deal" but natural gas barbecues may still be a possibility. Don Bemiss is currently working closely with members of the Fire Team on concepts and specifications. It is hope that by early Spring we will know how we can move forward. We will keep you posted as new information is available.

Celia's Corner - Forestry Report

Wildfires continue to ravage California, even into the New Year. As of December 31st, Lake Tahoe has received very little precipitation. If this trend continues, we will experience dangerously dry conditions this summer and fall. Our Townhouse Association will be working with our neighboring property owners, the Forest service, and the Tahoe Conservancy to reduce our collective fire vulnerability. We will also continue to reduce the fuel loads on our property by thinning and trimming trees, removing dead trees, aggressively trimming and removing all other flammable vegetation and raking pine needles away from our buildings.

We will again have our rake-off party this summer. Look for flyers about our July 8th event. If you can't join us then, please consider borrowing rakes and gloves from the office and doing some pine needle raking when it's convenient for you.

Reminder - Prevent Frozen Pipes

Units are experiencing frozen pipe issues. People need to leave their thermostats at 60 degrees or problems may occur. Consider posting a notice next to your thermostat so that family, friends and renters understand that when the temperature is below 35 degrees they need to set the thermostat to 60 degrees before leaving the unit.

Freeze Alert

Many homeowners have installed **Freeze Alert.** It costs \$250.00 and that includes installation by CW staff. You need an active phone line to connect the device to it. The Freeze Alert is programmed to call the office if the temperature in the unit goes below 40 degrees or if the power goes out in the unit. By calling the unit you can get the status inside the unit. It is programmed to answer after four rings and will give you the current temperature in the unit, if the power is on and the charge of the battery which is the back up if the power goes out.
